Take Acton to Save the San Gabriel Mountains National Monument

The 346,000-acre San Gabriel Mountains National Monument (SGMNM) was established by President Obama in October 2014. This action was taken at the request of the Sierra Club and many other local groups who had been working for over a decade to develop an alternative designation for the San Gabriel Mountains that would help bring in new resources to improve recreational and environmental conditions.

The San Gabriel Mountain National Monument is now under threat from the Trump Administration as they "review" 27 National Monuments for possible reduction in scope or elimination. **The public comment period ends July 10th** and we need your help building a strong public record in support of our monument. It only takes a few minutes. Go to https://www.regulations.gov/comment?D=DOI-2017-0002-0001 and tell the Trump administration why you value our monument and the San Gabriel Mountains - and to leave our monument alone.

The San Gabriel Mountains National Monument has already begun to show its value, generating new summer ranger positions and over \$5,000,000 in private donations, reopening shuttered visitor centers, increasing trash pickup, and launching the East Fork Project. This project, now in the planning stages, will improve visitor services and education, encourage transit-to-trails, increase cultural awareness, and protect aquatic habitat along a 2.5 mile stretch of the often-visited East Fork of the San Gabriel River north of Azusa in the monument.

The not so hidden agenda is that the Trump Administration wants to open up our public lands to fracking, coal mining, and downing of ancient trees for timber (think the Sequoia National Monument, which is also under review). Their special focus is Utah, on the Escalante Grand Staircase and the Bears Ears National Monuments that protect millions of acres of magnificent canyon country and plateaus between Utah's great national parks like Zion, Arches, Canyonlands, Capitol Reef and Bryce. The Administration has already proposed reducing the scope of Bears Ears, established by President Obama in 2016.

You can do your part by commenting right now using the link provided. Although our focus is on the San Gabriels, feel free to comment on any of the monuments mentioned above that you are familiar with. A strong public record will make it harder to the Trump Administration to take actions that damage our public lands.

REMINDER: Just one week left to provide your public comments on the Trump Administration plan to eliminate YOUR national monuments.

July 10th is the deadline, so please get your comments in supporting YOUR national monuments by using this official Dept of the Interior webpage for public comments on the national monument issue: https://www.regulations.gov/docket?D=DOI-2017-0002

Here in SoCal there are several NMs threatened with elimination, San Gabriel Mtns NM in LA county and Carizzo Plain NM in San Luis Obispo county and several CA Desert NMs which many of us visit. Also within visiting distant is Giant Sequoia NM and our own Channel Islands National Marine Sanctuary (offshore of Ventura and Santa Barbara counties) is under a separate Presidential order for possible elimination and the comment period closes on July 26ht just for Channel Islands NMS.

So far we have gotten in over one million public comments in support of retaining YOUR National Monuments.

Enjoy the cool 75 degree temperatures in mid-summer, walking through the pine forests on the upper slopes of Mt. San Jacinto. Two hikes from the top of the Palm Spring Tramway (8420') to Round Valley (9060') will be offered concurrently. Both hikes include the Round Valley loop. Longer route (8 miles round trip, 1750' gain) will include a hike to Wellmans Divide (9720') and back. Shorter route will be a more casual pace (6 miles round trip, 950' gain). Join us as we hike in the cool mountains of Big Bear to Delamar Mountain, one of the "seven peaks of Big Bear". Starting at the trailhead, we will climb the Cougar Crest Trail and follow the PCT to the peak (8398') and back, for a total of 12 miles round trip and 1550' of gain. Join us for this fascinating 8 days, 7 nights, exploration of Southern New Mexico. Highlights are Carlsbad Caverns and Guadalupe Mountains National Parks, White Sands, and Prehistoric Trackways National Monuments and Chamizal National Memorial. In between, we will visit the plaza of old Mesilla, and the stomping grounds of Billy the Kid in the historic town of Lincoln, and modern day museums such as the one about UFOs in Roswell, the White Sands Missile Range Museum, and the New Mexico Museum of Space History. Towns and Cities visited include El Paso, Texas, and Las Cruces, Alamogordo, Roswell, Carlsbad, in New Mexico.

Trip includes transportation via a 56 passenger Motor Coach from El Paso, to all stops, and returning to El Paso at the end of the trip. All Breakfasts, and up to two picnic lunches and Lodging for 2 people per room for 7 nights in middle range hotels such as Comfort Inns and similar places are included.
